Among a long list of other activities, we will need to apply for grants from charitable foundations. We need to communicate our intent and determination to these fondations in the most straightforward way possible.

At our upcoming November meeting I would like the membership to consider moving funds from other reserved monies into our tower fund.

I would suggest the following:

Move \$500 from the general fund to the tower fund. This would leave approximately \$1400 for our yearly expenses

Move \$250 from each of our equipment and building funds (\$500 total). Money in both of these accounts has gone unused for years.

Making these changes would move \$1000 into our tower fund bringing our total to nearly \$14000. I understand not all will agree with me on making these changes. I encourage all members to come and take part in the discussion. 73, Tom KC2SFU



### CVARA Youth Committee Antenna Build and Fox Hunt

On Sunday, October 15, CVARA members Tom Monday KC2SFU, Jon Englert W2BDN, and John Hysell K2HJ met at the Richfield Springs High School with 12 members of the Richfield Springs Community Youth Group, ranging from 8th-12th grade, and their advisors Rick, Tonya, Roger and FJ for a tape measure antenna build and foxhunt. We began the antenna build early at 8 AM with a quick lesson on yagi antennas and video on fox hunting. The antenna build went very smoothly and this was a great group of interested and motivated participants. All antennas were finished and tested(every antenna passed the analyzer test immediately) and with some time left before lunch we decided to give the foxhunt a quick run out in the athletic field behind the school. After arming the participants with radios(some with attenuators) and giving the participants a brief lesson on fox hunting KC2SFU went out and hid one of the foxes and the group proceeded to go out to find the fox. After about 20 minutes of searching two participants working together located the fox. I must say this was one enthusiastic group! We went back to the classroom, had lunch and discussed plans for the afternoon hunt. We hid two foxes in opposite directions of the village and unleashed our group of hunters. They were determined and they didn't let a couple of rain showers discourage them. They were successful in finding both foxes and because of the weather we retreated back to the classroom to discuss what they did and talk more about radio. In the span of an hour the questions kept coming and it was all Tom and I could do to answer them. Many in the group were interested in ham radio as were the adults. We talked about doing a future radio project with the group and discussed sources they could explore to get their ticket. We offered to bring in a VEC group if there were enough interested youths. All and all there was a lot of enthusiasm and the youths enjoyed the experience. ### And So It Should Be Written

### Chapter 15

### Welcome To - November 2023

While thinking of an opening for this chapter, I realized that I have been planning, composing my thoughts, and sharing many memories of my involvement with ham radio and CVARA. I certainly don't feel I qualify as an aspiring author and cannot do everything, but I can do something. If you have been following the past 14 chapters, a brief story of this writers past has been included, with questions still unanswered from my per-spective.

I figure it's time that I reflect upon, remember and treasure, many of the good times, places and people that I have come across in my life which have allowed me to continue on the remainder of my journey.

Although with many differences in opinion and actions/reactions to life in general, my family was an inspiration in facing the challenges and roadblocks that have, and continue to be, presented as we go forward. I was privileged to have had family members who served in the Military since the Revolutionary War. Some were Educators, Ministers/Pastors, Medical Professionals, Public Service Officials, Patent Holder-Inventors, Musicians, Printers, Electricians, Photographers etc. A great cross-section of categories I was introduced to and invited to pursue should I desire. Some have been discussed in previous chapters of this narrative.

With some reservations and imperfections, I give thanks for being a citizen of the United States. I served in the U.S. Air Force from 1960 to 1966, achieving the rank of Buck Sergeant (E-4). While America is not without her bruises and blemishes, she is still, by far, the best when it comes to freedom, opportunity and progress. For example: As discussed in Chapter 1, my own father, and best friend, ventured off to Chicago (1931–1932) to attend Coyne Electrical School earning degrees in both "Practical Electricity" and "Radio–TV Sound Reproduction". To help offset his college expenses, he played saxophone and piano in a dance band on weekends at what were called speakeasy's in the day. (My grandparents insisted that my father and all his siblings learn and become proficient in playing a musical instrument – very diverse group, as we had Violin, Piano, Organ, Trumpet, Cornet, Trombone, Saxophone, Clairnet etc). Obviously, insistence paid off!

Passing down that insistence to my generation inspired my love of music, in all its genres. I grew up listening to Big Band and Contemporary Jazz Sounds. Over the years I have played Trombone, Rhythm & Bass Guitar, Contemporary Jazz Organs (Hammond B-3 Style & Wersi Digital Series)

During the 1980's, I played many gigs at local venues and did demos for local Organ/Keyboard Dealers in the Unadilla, Binghamton, Cortland & Ithaca areas. I had the opportunity to meet and compare notes with many outstanding Professional Musicians, Organ and Keyboard Artists of their times. I still enjoy listening to the recorded Studio Sessions I was invited to attend with Wersi Recording Artists Rick Iannone and Dave Cooper (Graduates of The College of Performing Arts in Philadelphia and Berkeley School of Music respectively). Awesome days of music including product evaluation, advanced education in analog/digital electronics & performances from the pro's!

I no longer accept any gig opportunities, but do own and continue to play, for personal use and enjoyment, a full 66 keyoard-Roland Intelligent Synthesizer and an 88 keyboard-Yamaha Digital Grand Piano Synthesizer. When the ham bands propagation charts seem to be non-existent or unusually quiet, my mind does a reboot to the fascination of musical instruments, music composition and arrangements. So many things to accomplish, so little time to pursue all.



Let me introduce you to some of my acquaintances over the years whose names you may or may not recognize. One of the earliest coming to mind came as a result of my own father's interest in Radio-TV Sound Reproduction. While I can't remember the actual name on the store-front on Main Street in Sidney, NY (late 1940's-early 1950s), I'll call it "Wandelt's Radio-TV Shop." My father and the owner became friends early on and we were soon introduced to the world of B&W television! Being used to nothing but AM news broadcasts, listening to comic book, wild west, mystery book characters read over the air on our old Philco, a TV was a remarkable piece of equipment. A 10-12" B&W screen, with limited programming at first. WNBF-TV (Binghamton) was the only station we were able to receive in Sidney – air time only 1-2 hours of very fuzzy, snowy picture quality as I remember.

The owner of the Radio-TV Shop was a gentleman named Paul A. Wandelt. Paul was born on/about 24 March 1903 in Jersey City, NJ, son of a German immigrant. A curious young man, Paul, as I have

been told, sought work and was employed by the well known Lee De Forest. Inventor and electrical engineer, Lee De Forest held nearly 180 patents, but is best known by far for his 1907 improvements to the vacuum tube invented by John Ambrose Fleming. De Forest's innovation was a three-electrode vacuum tube, or triode, which he trademarked as the Audion, Capable of detecting, controlling and even amplifying electrical signals. The Audion revolutionized electronics and formed the basis for subsequent technologies including telephone, television, radar and early computer systems until the development of transistors in the late 1940's.
